As required by AS 44.62.250, notice is given that, under the authority of AS 44.47.800.820, the Department of Community and Regional Affairs adopted on January 19, 1993, as emergency regulations, 19 AAC 70.010-19 AAC 70.040. The regulation, C.H. 70. RURAL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE FUND, is a new chapter established under the Department's administrative regulations for a newly created rural small business loan program to be administered by the Rural Development Division of the Department under the above cited statutory authority. Adoption of these regulations will establish the criteria and procedures for use of money in the Rural Development Initiative Fund and address the following: Allowable uses of money in the fund, purchase of participation interest and size of participation interest, loan guarantees, reserve accounts of the fund, borrower and lender eligibility, servicing agreements, interest rates, required collateral and general terms of loans, loan assumptions and modifications and loan application review and appeal.

This regulation takes effect on January 19, 1993.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

1. add Glennallen to the service area map;
2. revise the list of locations where company facilities are available to show that the Kodiak Coast Guard, Seward, Valdez, and Glennallen (a new location with company facilities) have equal access;
3. reduce to zero the monthly rates for four Alternative Billing Formats (Mag Tape Only, Disk Only, Paper and Mag Tape, and Paper and Disk) in the Special Billing Services Section; and
4. delete the employee benefit feature from the schedule of charges for the Precision 30/6 Service.

If the Commission finds that the rates proposed by GCICC are not just and reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that proposed.
