

# Permits required for 'trespassers'

People who reside in cabins built on federal lands in any of Alaska's new national parks, preserves or monuments have until Oct. 20 to file applications for permits required to continue residing in "trespass" cabins, according to the National Park Service.

People who built or purchased and started using their cabins before Dec. 1, 1978, and who have lived in those cabins for a substantial portion of the time may qualify to obtain a permit for exclusive use of the cabin.

Many people already have obtained their cabin permits, and they need not be concerned with the deadline.

Those who believe they may qualify for a residential cabin permit and would like further information may contact the superintendent of the park in which the cabin is located or call the Ranger Activities Division in the National Park Service regional office in Anchorage at 271-2660.
