Voting Patterns

COLLEGE—A description of voting patterns of approximately 160 rural Alaska villages for the election years from 1958 to 1968 has been published by the University of Alaska's Institute of Social, Economic and Government Research (ISEGR).

In an ISEGR Research Note entitled, "Electoral Behavior of Alaska Native Villages," Dr. Gordon S. Harrison, assistant professor of political science at ISEGR, presents data concerning the total number of rural Native voters, the number of villages participating in elections, in the distribution of rural Native electoral strength, party preferences among the Natives, and other related information.
