Graduates told to use qualities of past for future lives

Members of the 1981 graduating class at Kotzebue High School were told that they would need the qualities of their Inupiaq parents and grandparents humor, cooperation, charing, common sense and humility-to make their way in today's society.

Willie Hensley, president of the NANA Development Corp., delivered that advice to the graduating class during ceremonies last week in Kotzebue.

"For those of us in NANA, we hope that the students, the graduates, will keep the spirit and come back and help to manage the land and resources of the people.

All but 10 of the 36 graduates have plans to further their formal education outside in the Northwest Arctic School District region while a few of the rest plan to leave the region to seek work

"You can be anywhere, said Hensley. "But we want you to be with us, at least in spirit. Your people at home need you, and you need them.... and we all pray that you will not be educated to abandon those you love in pursuit of economic success."

Hensley compared survival in the political and economic world with the similar qualities needed by his forefathers, for 10,000 years of survival in the harshest climate on earth.

'Survival in the business world and the political world requires a knowledge of the environment that you are working in. You have to know your targets. You have to know the strengths and weaknesses of your competition. You have to have some intuition. You have to have some will power. And you have to have some knowledge of your own limits. And these are things that people had to know in this environment throughout the top of the world," he said.

Hensley said that "many of us must begin to re-educate ourselves in the Inupiaq way," although maintaining the Inupiaq identity does not mean sacrificing the modern way of life, he said.

"It is not necessary to lose your identity to learn technology and skills," said Hensley. "But the world beyond Kotzebue High School is not going to fall into your lap... and using the excuse that you are in Inupiat is not going to carry you anywhere, either. If your are going to survive both today and tomorrow, it will take the same
