SEALED Bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, equipment and materials and performing all work on Project F-021-1(23), Homer Spit described herein, will be received until 11:00 a.m., prevailing time, May 20, 1969, in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consists of grading, gravel surfacing, and erosion control along Homer Spit, from Kachemak Bay Road southerly 2.17 miles.

Principal items of work will consist of the following: 194,000 cubic yards of embankment; 138,000 cubic yards of riprap, Class I through Class V; 45,000 square yards of Polypropylene Filter Cloth; and miscellaneous items of work.

SEALED bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, equipment, and materials, and performing all work on Project S-0474(3), Seward Airport Road, described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m., prevailing time, May 27, 1969, in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consists of grading, drainage, and hot bituminous pavement of 0.343 miles of road-way in the City of Seward, Alaska.

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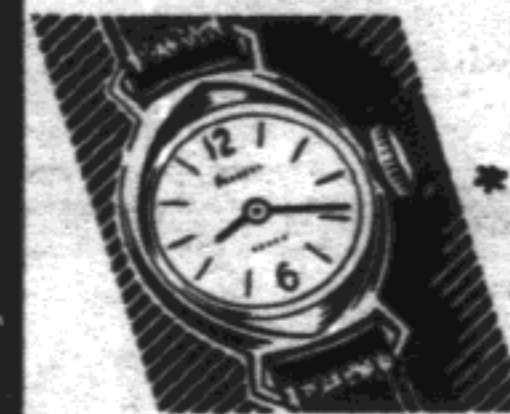
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
