

Duties and Responsibilities:

As the leader of the NSHEC, the Director must possess a high degree of professional competence, coupled with authentic sensitivity to the shifting needs and demands of a non-traditional educational institution. The Director needs to exhibit considerable cross-disciplinary skill and expertise in order to refine and foster an organization that operates with academic integrity and cultural respect. The Director is responsible for:

- The overall functioning of the NSHEC, by demonstrating leadership and expertise in the academic, administrative, and fiscal spheres;
- Maintaining a culturally-sensitive climate supportive of teaching, learning, student-development, scholarship, research, and service;
- Providing open and effective channels of communication among the departments and faculty within the NSHEC, as well as with the institutions, organizations, and individuals that comprise its clientele;
- Serves as the major liaison with the University of Alaska-Fairbanks'
- The preparation, implementation, and evaluation of the Center's budget and fiscal policies;
- Recruitment, appointment, evaluation, promotion, and termination of all NSHEC personnel;
- Articulating the policies, needs, and accomplishments of the NSHEC to the larger university structures, as well as the internal/external publics; and
- Teaching at least one course per semester within his/her field of specialization.

- An earned doctorate in an appropriate field of study;
- Demonstrated commitment to and understanding of higher education within a non-traditional education setting;
- Demonstrated commitment to local/community control and direction of educational programming within non-traditional settings;
- Extensive knowledge of educational theories, trends, ideas, and resources, especially as they apply to non-traditional Native American, rural, and/or field-based programs;
- Solid understanding of and demonstrated commitment of the maintenance of Native American values, traditions, and institutions;
- Commitment to and understanding of the centrality of teaching and scholarship within a community context;
- Commitment to student growth and development and the demonstrated ability to recognize special student needs;
- Extensive knowledge of fund-raising, grant-writing, and educational-development activities;
- Excellent communication skills in both formal and informal settings;
- Demonstrated competence in management of fiscal affairs;
- Well-developed interpersonal skills and acute sensitivities required to relate to diverse publics;
- Personal style characterized by integrity, flexibility, and honesty;
- Extensive college teaching experience;
- Extensive experience in distance delivery of courses and programs.

Preferred Qualifications

- Bilingual (English/Inupiaq);
- Extensive knowledge of the geographic, climatic, and political conditions of the North Slope of Alaska, or other Arctic areas.
- Experience in Native American, multicultural, or bi-cultural situations.

The requirements for class eligibility are as follows: (1) The applicant gave a Native allotment application to a RuralCAP worker before December 18, 1971, and the application was not delivered to the United States government; (2) The applicant is a full or mixed-blood Native and 21 years of age; (3) The applicant has not already received a Native allotment; (4) The applicant sent a letter to the court before November 22, 1982; and (5) The applicant submitted a consent to adjudication and limited waiver to BLM. Any evidence submitted pursuant to this notice must relate to one or more of the above requirements.
