I remember I use to give him one or two weseal skin. Which is \$1.00 ea. and tell him get me jacket, cap, gloves, socks and bag of candy. That's little to big of order for one dollar. But I order what I need anyway.

He make that trip with dog

team use eight dogs but still take him sixteen days. This is about 160 miles across country.

While he was gone my mother and I. We haul wood with are neck to keep are log cabin warm in 60 below weather.

Sometime I go out hunting for snow birds or rabbit my mother use to give me five 22 shells that got to be sure shot to get three bird and 2 rabbit. Before my mother will be happy.

When my father come home all I get is one little bag of candy for that one weaseal skin I sent out. Rest of the order is gone because rest of the order is to big for \$1.00. That was early days.

Today when we went go to Fort Yukon, all we have to do is get are ticket and get in flight. Take 55 minute to get in Fort Yukon. We got are own store lots of groceries and clothing. Which we call. Midnight Son

Native Store.

Almost everything is doing it by machine like a Sno-go, washing machine, chain saws, cat, outboard motor, things like that.

Since last four year we been working on new village, by the Community Action to build theis new house there is some family move in to there new house already.

And we still got lots work to do on it yet. We thank God for all this work done in are village.
