

Would Solicit Contributions

Ralph Perdue, president of Alaska's statewide community action group (AS CAP) told the Tundra Times this morning he would solicit contributions from Native associations and other community groups in the state to raise \$9,600 for a 10 per cent matching fund to a federal grant of \$96,000.

Perdue said he would ask Native associations in Fairbanks, Barrow, Kotzebue, Anchorage, southeast Alaska and Bethel, as well as the village council of Tyonek for contributions to help keep Alaska's OEO programs rolling.

In addition, letters will be written to other village councils, he said.

Help can be in the form of in-kind services that could be valued as cash. Office space or equipment could be used.
