

# Fish & Wildlife Service seeks public comment on migratory bird hunting

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has initiated a public involvement process for the development of regulations for spring and summer subsistence hunting of migratory birds in Alaska.

An official said 80,000 copies of a special tabloid have been printed and

public meetings have begun in 14 communities throughout the state.

"The meetings are to provide an opportunity for people to comment on how subsistence hunting of migratory birds should be managed," said James Gritman, acting regional director.
