Over 100 delegates from all over Alaska and the Pacific Northwest are in attendance at this, the Grandparent of all Alaska Native organizations.

The Grand Camp Alaska Native Brotherhood and Sisterhood has already passed resolutions strongly opposing the capital move and strongly opposing the repeal of the current subsistence law.

In a very special action, the organization has named ANB executive committeeman Roy Peratrovich (Anchorage) as Grand President emeritus. This very special honor is reserved for the recognition of past presidents who have shown great dedication and contribution to the ANB and ANS.

Recently the Grand Camp elections were held. The elected leadership will serve for a year's term, until the next Grand Camp convention.
