

# Artworks commissioned

Four original artworks have been commissioned by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game under the state's one per cent for art program.

The four works, including a mural, two relief carvings and a sculpture will be displayed at new fish hatchery sites at Moose Pass, and at the Ship Creek Hatchery on Ft. Richardson.

The proposed Trail Lakes Hatchery, soon to be constructed at Moose Pass will have a 69-foot mural by artist Harold Balazs of Mead, Wash. and a 12 by 18 foot bronze sculpture by Petersburg artist Carson Boyesen. The enamel on steel mural will depict mature sockeye salmon and will be displayed on an exterior wall visible from the Seward Highway. The sculpture titled C-Wave will consist of small bronze fish welded in the shape of a breaking wave. Each piece will cost \$30,000.

Appel plans a dolomite limestone relief depicting fish for the Ship Creek complex. Cost of the piece is \$18,000.

Jim Schoppert, formerly of Juneau will carve a 7 by 32-foot wood panel using designs abstracted from traditional Northwest artwork. Cost of the piece is \$20,000.
