Many Alaskans think that Bartlett, more than any one man, has done great things for Alaska.

Sen. Bartlett was a man of humble beginnings. He worked as a miner and for a time as a journalist.

He later became a delegate to the U.S. House fo Rperesentatives when Alaska was under a territorial status.

When Alaska became a state in 1959, Bartlett was elected U.S. Senator, the office he held until his death last Wednesday.

Words of shock and praise for the Alaska Senator have been coming from all voer the country. On November 21, Sen. Bartlett underwent a surgery to correct an arterial blockage involving the heart. The surgery was thought to be successful and the senator began to show improvement.

He later suffered a relapse and was near death for several days. He finally succumbed to his illness Wednesday, ending a brilliant career in public life.

He is survived by his wife Vide and two daughters, Susan Bartlett and Doris Riley.

Sen. Bartlett will be buried here in Fairbanks Saturday, a city in which he was raised.
