1. DESCRIPTION:

The Alaska Native Health Board is seeking the services of one or more professional consultant(s) with major health policy and management experience to analyze the impact of current Indian Health Service (IHS) resource distribution methodologies on the different service units/area of Alaska and to recommend modifications to the model in an attempt to enhance equity in the distribution of health care resources throughout the state. The consultant(s) will be responsible for analyzing Native health care resource data all over Alaska and, based on the results, formulating viable recommendations or options for modifying various modules within the current IHS resource allocation methodology (RAM).

Serious respondent(s) should possess the following:

- knowledge of both IHS and regional contract health service programs; and
- knowledge of health care information/data systems.

Essential skills required by the consultant(s) will include quantitative analysis, accounting, and health care planning experience.

Termination of Section 17(b) Public Easement

On September 30, 1983, The Kuskokwim Corporation (successor in Interest to Red Devil Incorporated) received Interim Conveyance No. 739 for the surface estate of certain lands selected under the provisions of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971, and Calista Corporation received Interim Conveyance No. 740 for Sec. 17(b) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, the Secretary of the Interior was authorized to reserve such public easements across Native-selected lands as he deemed necessary to guarantee access to public lands and major water ways or to fulfill agreements or international treaty obligations. Easements within Interim Conveyance No. 739 were issued in accordance with the November 27, 1978 guidelines. However, in the process of easement identification for a new conveyance near Red Devil, Alaska, it was found that the following easement should never have been included in Interim Conveyance No. 739 and, therefore, is terminated.

EASEMENT TO BE TERMINATED

2. c. (EIN 14a C5) An easement fifty (50) feet in width for an existing access trail from the southeastern boundary of U.S. Survey 3771, sec. 31, T. 20 N., R. 44 W., Seward Meridian, and continuing in a southwesterly direction to public lands. The uses allowed are those listed above for a fifty (50) foot wide trail easement.

Easements to be terminated will be removed from our easement records and a formal Release of Interest issued when this decision becomes final.

In accordance with Departmental policy, notice of this decision is being published once a week, for four (4) consecutive weeks in The Anchorage Times, The Anchorage Daily News, The Tundra Drums, and the Tundra Times.

Any party claiming a property interest in lands affected by this decision, an agency of the federal government, or regional corporation may appeal the decision to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, office of Hearings and Appeals, in accordance with the regulation in Title 43 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), part 4, subpart E, as revised.

OF EMERGENCY REGULATIONS**

As required by AS 44.62.250, notice is given that, under authority vested by AS 44.47.980 and subsection (c) of sec. 2, ch. 94, SLA 1984 as amended by sec. 2, ch. 53, SLA 1986, the Department of community and Regional Affairs, adopts as an emergency regulation 19 ACC 50 relating to the establishment of a process by which municipalities, impacted by oil or gas leasing in the National Petroleum Reserve - Alaska, may apply for and be eligible to receive grants to alleviate that impact.

The primary objective of the NPR-A Impact Program is to provide municipalities with financial assistance to help mitigate adverse impacts related to oil or gas leasing within the NPR-A, including exploration, production, and oil or gas transportation activities conducted under the authority of 42 U.S.C. 6508. Financial assistance may be available for planning, construction, maintenance, and operation of essential public facilities and other necessary provisions of public service.

Eligibility for assistance has two components: applicant eligibility and project eligibility as addressed in the regulations. Applicants must submit completed forms provided by the Department postmarked no later than September 15. The Department will review application for eligibility for NPR-A impact assistance and place applications in order of priority established within the regulations. Decisions in awarding of grants are final but subject to judicial review pursuant to State of Alaska Court Appellate Rule 602.

This regulation takes effect July 29, 1986.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.
