

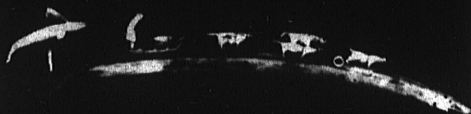
WORK STUDY GRANTS IN PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

A number of work study/internship grants, for minority and low income students, are available for full-time University of Alaska, Juneau, Public Administration program students. While employed up to half-time in state agencies, or by Native, or other non-profit organizations and while being paid by the state at the internship rate, students may receive up to \$5,000 plus free tuition and books.

WELCOME TO THE WORLD OF ALASKAN ARTS AND CRAFTS You'll find a wide variety of fascinating and beautiful souvenir and craft items in Alaskan gift shops and stores. Some of them were manufactured in Alaska, some in the "Lower 48", and some were even manufactured abroad and imported into the state. But as you browse and discover the extraordinary array of art and craft items, keep in mind that these two emblems are your guarantee that the piece you purchase was handcrafted in Alaska by Alaskan craftsmen and artists.



The "Silver Hand" means that the article before you was handmade in Alaska by an Alaska Native—an Aleut, Eskimo, or Indian craftsman or artist. The Alaska Resident emblem indicates that the art or craft item was handcrafted by an Alaskan.



Wherever possible, Alaskan art or craft items bearing these emblems have been made with Alaskan materials. Some materials, while indigenous to Alaska, have

been imported from other countries and crafted here.
