Wesley is an Eskimo. While he was a boy his dad Johnny A. Aiken, Eskimo, was hit by a tractor. After he was hit, the Eskimos took him to the ANS hospital, but Johnny never recover.

Johnny would be around 73 if he was living because we grew up together, but Johnny was older than we.

FRESH CARIBOU MEAT

Sam Hopson, son of Mr. Steve Hopson, Eskimo, also employee of Wien Consolidated Airline for

several years in Fairbanks, said today that he and George Ungarook, also Eskimo, bring several caribou from Kimialuk.

Sam said he can have fresh meat for winter. Sam and his wife Mabel, daughter of Mr. David Brower settled down in Fairbanks. David and his family moved to a new village called Nuksut.

According to Sam Hopson, he said lakes up along interior above Barrow village are all freeze, no danger at all to cross the lakes and rivers. Sam was taking his vacation and instead hunting in Fairbanks, he went up to Barrow where he knows that he could hunt better there in Barrow village area.
