The Alaska Salary Commission (under authority of AS 39.23.010 - 130, effective June 25, 1976) is required to submit a report of its preliminary findings and recommendations on salaries and retirement benefits every two years to the Governor, the Presiding Officers of each House of the Legislature, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and to seek public input. Salary Commission recommendations are limited to the elected and appointed officials of State government listed in this notice. The last such report was submitted November 5, 1976.
After the Salary Commission has reviewed public comments on the preliminary recommendations, a final report is required to be submitted to the Legislature before the tenth day of the 1979 Legislative session. Final recommendations will not become effective unless approved by concurrent resolution of the Legislature.

On the list below, current salary is the annual amount in effect since January 1, 1977; proposed salary in the annual amount recommended to be effective January 1, 1979.

The only new proposal concerning retirement benefits is that present Supreme Court Justices and Superior and District Court Judges start contributing to their retirement plan at the rate of one per cent (1%) of proposed base salary, beginning January 1, 1979.

In arriving at its preliminary findings and recommendations, the Salary Commission considered the following factors:
Written and oral comments from the affected officials;
The effect of inflation on purchasing power since January 1977;

Salaries and retirement benefits of comparable officials in other states;
Present and projected trends in the Consumer Price Index ("cost-of-living index");

Comparison of salaries and benefits to those received by other State employees;

The fact that proposed salaries and retirement benefits would continue for two years — 1979 and 1980 — without interim adjustment.

This year, to assure a higher degree of public participation in its findings and recommendations than the level achieved by public hearings in 1976, the Salary Commission is soliciting comments by mail. A copy of the complete Preliminary Report may be obtained by writing to the Salary Commission.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA COASTAL POLICY COUNCIL
Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Coastal Policy Council, under authority vested by AS 46.40.040(1) and AS 46.49.893(1), proposed to amend regulations in Title 6 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 46.40.040(1) and AS 44.19.893(1), as follows:

(1) 6 AAC 80.040(b), Coastal Development, is amended by clarifying the standards governing the placement of structures and the discharge of dredged or fill material into coastal water;

(2) 6 AAC 80.060, Recreation, is amended by adding a new provision concerning public access to coastal water;

(3) 6 AAC 80.070, Energy Facilities, is amended by adding comprehensive standards governing the siting and approval of major energy facilities in the coastal area;

(4) 6 AAC 80.080(a), Transportation and Utilities, is amended by deleting the phrase "local comprehensive plans";
(5) 6 AAC 80.100, Timber Harvest and Processing, is amended by deleting the phrases "unrestricted movement (of fish)" and "unrestricted passage (of fish)" and adding the phrase "free passage and movement of fish", deleting the phrase "potential for" preceding the phrase "adverse environmental impacts", and adding a provision concerning shoreline protection and fish and wildlife resources and habitats;

(6) 6 AAC 80.110(a), Mining and Mineral Processing, is amended by deleting the phrases "regional programs" and "local comprehensive plans";

(7) 6 AAC 80.160(a), Areas Which Merit Special Attention, is amended by clarifying the roles of the Alaska Coastal Policy Council, coastal resource districts, and other persons in the designation of areas which merit special attention;

(8) 6 AAC 80.900, Definitions, is amended by adding definitions of the terms "feasible and prudent", "including", and "major energy facilities";

(9) 6 AAC 900, Definitions, is amended by repealing and reenacting the definition of the term "geophysical hazards";

(10) 6 AAC 85.040(a), Boundaries, is amended by requiring coastal resource districts to include, in district programs, a map of federal lands within the district which may become subject to the coastal management program;

(11) 6 AAC 85.130(b), Public Involvement, is amended by expanding the requirements for public notice prior to the adoption of district coastal management programs or amendments to district coastal management programs;

(12) 6 AAC 85.150, Council Review, is amended by expanding the requirements for public notice during the Alaska Coastal Policy Council's review of district coastal management programs; and

(13) 6 AAC 85.900, Definitions, is amended by adding definitions of the terms "feasible and prudent" and "including".
