

Campbell contributions highest with \$512,370

The Alaska Public Offices Commission has released its preliminary totals for the contributions that candidates for the gubernatorial and lieutenant governor races have reported receiving and spending in 1989 and 1990, with Republican gubernatorial candidate James Campbell reporting the largest amount of contributions — \$512,370.

The first reporting period is all of 1989. The second period starts with the beginning of the campaign or Jan. 1, 1990, and ends July 26, 1990.

The second highest reported amount of contributions is that for Democratic gubernatorial hopeful Tony Knowles with \$501,184.

The 10 gubernatorial candidates have reported total contributions of more than \$2 million, with almost \$1.6 million in contributions more than \$100.

Republican candidate for lieutenant governor, Tim Kelly, has raised more than \$150,000, almost twice the amount of fellow COP candidate Jack Coghill.
