NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Natural Resources, under authority vested by AS 46.15.020, proposes to adopt regulations in Title 11 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement and interpret AS 46.15 as follows:

Article 1 covers "grandfather rights" established before the Water Use Act went into effect and explains hearings on a determination of grandfather rights.

Article 2 sets forth the method of applying for a water appropriation and adjudication of applications. It

requires the filing of well logs and other information.

Article 3 requires a permit before the construction of an earthen dam 10 feet or more in height. It lists the construction standards for large dams and establishes the fee to be charged for the permit.

Article 4 provides for simplified procedures to allow temporary water use.

Article 5 provides for the availability of adequate water to furnish a public water supply when adequate water is not available to furnish all water uses.

Article 6 requires a permit before the alteration of a water body.

Article 7 describes the actions the commissioner will take to protect the public health, safety and welfare and water resources.

Article 8 covers the method of appealing a water use decision or order.

Article 9 sets forth the general procedures for applying for, transferring, recording or revoking a water appropriation and defines specific words used in the regulations.

NORTH SLOPE BOROUGH NOTICE OF GENERAL ELECTION

1. Date of Election: October 3, 1978.

2. Time of opening and closing of the Polling Places: The polling places shall be open between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M.

3. Location of Precinct, Polling Places and Description of Voting Precincts by Boundary:

ANAKTUVUK PASS PRECINCT.

Beginning at the peak of Soakpak Mt.; thence southerly to the peak of Kollukut Mt., thence easterly to the peak of Three River Mt., thence northerly to the peak of Mt. Stuver; thence westerly to the peak of Soakpak Mt.

Polling Place: High School-Dome

BARROW PRECINCT.

Beginning at 150 degrees west longitude and the boundary of the State of Alaska in the Arctic Ocean; thence southerly along 150 degrees west longitude to its point of intersection with 68 degrees north latitude; thence westerly along 68 degrees north latitude to its point of intersection with a north-south line drawn through Point Franklin on the west; thence northerly along a north-south line drawn through Point Franklin on the west to the boundary of the State of Alaska in the Arctic Ocean; thence easterly along the boundary of the State of Alaska to 150 degrees west longitude; the point of beginning excluding Browerville and Anaktuvuk Pass Precincts.

Polling Place: North Slope Borough Administration Building Assembly Room

BARTER ISLAND PRECINCT.

That area beginning at a point on the International Boundary between Alaska and the Dominion of Canada and the intersection of the boundary of the North Slope Borough; thence northerly along the boundary common to the State of Alaska and Canada to the northernmost boundary of the State of Alaska; thence meandering westerly to its intersection with 150 degrees west longitude; thence southerly along 150 degrees west longitude to its intersection with 68 degrees north latitude; thence easterly along 68 degrees north latitude to its intersection with 146 degrees west longitude; thence northerly along the 146 degree west longitude line to its intersection with 68 degrees 30' north latitude line to the easterly boundary of the State of Alaska on the International Boundary the point of beginning.

Polling Place: Old BIA School

BROWERVILLE PRECINCT.

Beginning where the outlet of Tislagrook Lagoon empties into the Arctic Ocean; thence upstream in the center of said Tislagrook Lagoon; thence along the south side of said lagoon and the southerly side of Isakook Lagoon to the most southerly point; thence due east to Ellison Lagoon. This precinct includes Doctor Island, Deadmans Island, the DEW Line Installation, Arctic Research Laboratory and the International Telephone and Telegraph site.

Polling Place: T-4 Four-plex, Herman Street

NUQSUT PRECINCT.

Beginning at 150 degrees 59' 36" west longitude and 70 degrees 12' 30" north latitude at the south bank of Nechelek channel thence meander southerly along the bluff for approximately one mile thence westerly, northerly and easterly to the point of beginning to include all of the new townsite of Nuqsut.

Polling Place: Nuqsut Health Center.

POINT HOPE PRECINCT.

All of that area draining into the Arctic Ocean from Cape Thompson to Cape Lisbourne, including the military site.

Polling Place: Public Safety Building

POINT LAY PRECINCT.

Beginning at 162 degrees 57' 30" west longitude and 69 degrees 45' 10" north latitude to include the new and old townsites of Pt. Lay and Kaktovik river delta.

Polling Place: Amos Agnasagga's

WAINWRIGHT PRECINCT.

All of that area draining into the Arctic Ocean from Cape Lisbourne on the west to a north south line drawn through Pt. Franklin on the east.

4. The qualifications of voters: A person may vote who:

- (1) is a citizen of the United States, qualified to vote in the State of Alaska elections.
- (2) has been a resident of the North Slope Borough for 30 days immediately preceding the date of election.
- (3) is registered to vote in State of Alaska elections.
- (4) is not disqualified under Article V of the Constitution of the State of Alaska.

5. The type of election: The election is a general election.

6. The propositions submitted to the electors are:

- (a) The following seats are open in the North Slope Borough Government for election:
Three (3) Assembly seats of the North Slope Borough Assembly, each 3 year term
Three (3) seats of the North Slope Borough School Board, each 3 year term
North Slope Borough Mayor, 3 year term

(b) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of EIGHTEEN MILLION FOUR HUNDRED FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$18,404,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of schools in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance Number 78-4 (A) of the North Slope Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(c) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed THREE MILLION ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,150,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of public roads, streets and sidewalks in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment and facilities necessary for the construction, repair and maintenance of roads, streets and sidewalks, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands, in connection therewith in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-5 (A) of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(d) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of TWENTY-ONE MILLION TWO HUNDRED EIGHTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$21,285,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of public housing in the North Slope Borough together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings and facilities, and the acquisition of land or rights in land in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-6 of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on April 11, 1978.

(e) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY-TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$882,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of public housing and urban renewal, rehabilitation and development in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-7 (A) of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(f) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of TWELVE MILLION NINE HUNDRED NINETEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$12,919,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of public housing and urban renewal, rehabilitation and development in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-8 (A) of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(g) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of TWO MILLION THREE HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,313,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of Public Safety Facilities in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-9 (A) of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(h) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$80,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of Sanitary Facilities including water and sewerage treatment and disposal in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings, and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith in accordance with and ratifying the provisions of Ordinance 78-11 of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on April 11, 1978.

(i) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of TWO MILLION EIGHTY-TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,821,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of water facilities of the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-15 of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(j) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of TWO MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,777,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of Sewage Treatment and Disposal Facilities in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-16 of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(k) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of ONE HUNDRED TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$120,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of Health Facilities including dental and medical outpatient treatment facilities and medical special staff housing in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-17 of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(l) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of ONE MILLION ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,156,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of Telephone Facilities in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-20 of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(m) Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, repair, reconstruction, or acquisition of Telephone Facilities in the North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance 78-20 of the North Slope Borough adopted by the Borough Assembly on September 5, 1978.

(n) Shall an exclusive franchise be granted to Tundra Tours, Inc., a subsidiary of Arctic Slope Regional Corporation and an Alaskan corporation, to operate a bus transportation service for passengers and their baggage along the Haul Road within the North Slope Borough.
