

Three Seward Peninsular Villages Declared Eligible Under the Claims

According to Bering Straits Aglutuk, published by the Bering Straits Native Corporation, three unlisted villages in the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act have been determined as eligible under the act.

The villages approved are Council, King Island and Solomon. Haycock, which was included in the unlisted list, did

not qualify for eligibility.

Council is upriver from the village of White Mountain on the Neukluk River. King Island is located out from Nome on the Bering Sea and Solomon is east of Nome on the coast.

Haycock was a former mining community. All of the localities are located on the Seward Peninsula.
