

Sen. Miller May Run for U.S. Senate

FAIRBANKS—State Senator Terry Miller, R-Fairbanks, indicated this week that he may challenge another State Senator, C.R. Lewis, R-Anchorage, in the primary and if he wins, he would challenge U.S. Senator Mike Gravel, D-Alaska, in the general election.

Senator Miller also indicated that he may challenge Democratic Governor William A. Egan for the governorship of the state.

"Both Governor Egan and Senator Gravel would be formidable opponents," Miller said.

He has not announced but he said he may do that in the near future with a decision whether he will run for U.S. Congress or the governorship of Alaska.

Miller was elected to the State House of Representatives when he was 23 years old in 1966. Two years later, he was elected to the State Senate.

There is, at the moment, a fast-growing list of challengers to the U.S. Senate seat of Senator Gravel. These are: Dick Greuel, D-Fairbanks; State Rep. Gene Guess, D-Anchorage; State Sen. C.R. Lewis, R-Anchorage; and possibly Senator Miller.
