

# Ivey Named Executive Director for Native Health Service

Department of HEW Announces Job Says Dr. John Lee

Gerald H. Ivey has been appointed to the position of executive officer for the Alaska Area Native Health Service. Confirmation of Ivey's appointment has been received from the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, according to Dr. John F. Lee, Director, AANHS.

Ivey assumes responsibility for policies and procedures as they impact upon budget, manpower, material and facilities involved in Native Health Programs.

He will serve as principal advisor to the Area Director of the Alaska Native Health Service, which comprises seven service units providing comprehensive health services for approximately 55,000 Alaskan Natives located in cities, towns, and small villages throughout Alaska's 586,400 square miles.

Born in McGrath, Alaska and

a lifelong resident of the state, Ivey is an active leader in Native affairs. An alumnus of Mt. Edgecumbe High School, he is past president of the Fairbanks Native Association.

He has served on the State Rural Affairs Commission, on the Board of Directors of the Alaska Federation of Natives, and the Tundra Times Corporation.

He is also a member of the Alaska Native Brotherhood, the Cook Inlet Native Association, and Doyon, Inc. For the past four years, he has worked closely with the Alaska Native Health Board in the formulation of Native health policies.

Gerald Ivey graduated from the University of Alaska in 1961, received his Master's degree in Education in 1964 and in 1972 was awarded the Master of Public Health degree from the University of California, Berkeley,

Calif.

He was a teacher and a principal for the State Operated Schools at Ft. Wainwright, Alaska from 1961 to 1969. He joined the United States Public Health Service in 1969 as chief of Native Affairs for the Alaska Area Native Health Service.

Ivey is married to the former Rosalie Trejo; they have three sons.

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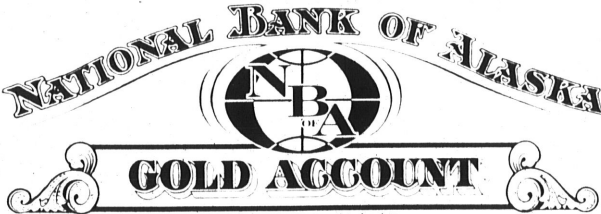

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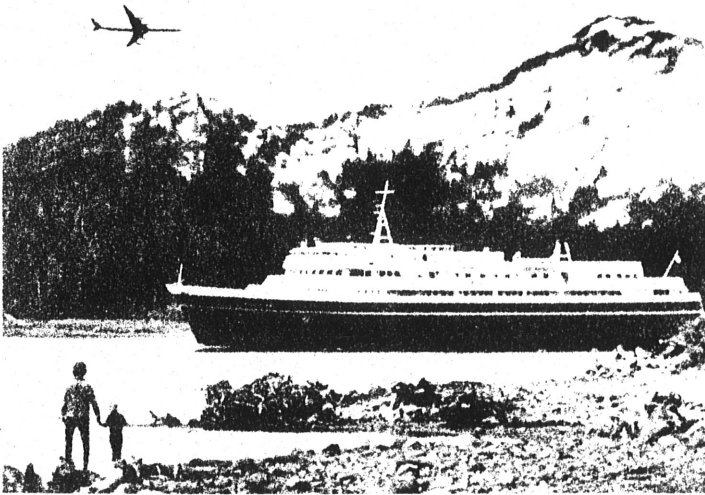
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
