PERTAINING TO STATE OWNED OR OPERATED RURAL AIRPORTS

As required by AS 44.62.250, notice is given that, under the authority of AS 02.10.010, 02.15.020, and 02.15.060, the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities ("department") proposes to adopt, amend, and repeal state airport regulations in Title 17 of the Alaska Administrative Code pertaining to state owned or operated rural airports. This notice supplements the public notice dated November 7, 1996.

After considering requests by interested parties, the department has determined that additional time is needed for the public to comment on these proposed regulations. The deadline date for submitting written comments to the department is extended to 4:30 p.m. January 24, 1997.

Following the close of the extended public comment period, the department may make revisions to the proposed regulations available for public review beginning on February 28, 1997. The public will then have from February 28, 1997 until 4:30 p.m. on March 28, 1997 to submit written comments to the department on any revised proposed regulations.
