

Alaska airports get \$11 million

WASHINGTON — Alaska airports will receive more than \$11 million from the U.S. Department of Transportation's Airport Improvement Program, according to Sen. Ted Stevens, R-Alaska.

The distribution includes:

- \$7,243,347 to the Juneau airport for the construction of taxiways, an apron and an access road and the installation of taxiway lights.

- \$1,312,000 for the construction of taxiways and taxiway signs at the Fairbanks airport.

- \$1,396,885 to the airport at Kake for removing an obstruction and paving a runway, taxiway, apron and access road.

- \$600,000 to the airport at Metlakatla to expand a seaplane float.

- \$241,162 for building signs and displacing lights at the Kodiak airport.

- \$100,000 for an emergency power generator at the Yakutat airport.

- \$253,125 for a seaplane float at Kasaan.
