A primary function of TRACE is to help identify and refer those children from birth to 6 years of age needing but not receiving services. To assist in this identification process, a "Totline" number has been established (274-1666 - collect calls accepted 8:30 - 4:30 Alaska Standard Time) to be used by parents. professionals, paraprofessionals, agencies or other persons interested in obtaining services for these children.

Other functions of the pro-

gram will include revision and distribution of the Alaska Directory of Services for the Preschool Handicapped Child; description of preschool programs in Alaska and distribution upon request to those who work with preschoolers; description of teaching materials that have been developed or adapted especially for Alaska and dis--tribution of same upon request.
