

Fish & Wildlife Service Says Federal Permit Needed to Hunt Kodiak Bears

The Fish and Wildlife Service reminds hunters that a federal permit is required to hunt brown bears within the Kodiak National Wildlife Refuge.

This fall the season will open October 20 and continue through December 31.

The refuge is sectioned into 52 units and only one party of

hunters is assigned to a unit at a time. There is no limit to the number of permits issued so conflicts may occur.

In such instances, the second party applying for an area must either wait until the first party has completed its hunt or select an alternate unit.

Those people desiring a permit should request an application form by contacting the Refuge Manager, Kodiak National Wildlife Refuge, Box 825, Kodiak, Alaska 99615.

Guides may make applications for their clients. Permits will be issued in the order the

applications are received from the effective date of this announcement, September 5, 1972.

A permit is not required to hunt bears outside the Kodiak Refuge boundaries in the remainder of State Game Management Unit 8.

Careers Manpower Training Prog. to Get Funds

Alaska will receive additional federal funding for a new Careers Manpower Training program sponsored by the Alaska State Department of Labor.

Senator Ted Stevens said that the \$114,070 funding extends the statewide project for 52 weeks to July 18, 1973.

The new careers program

emphasizes pre-professional occupational training providing training and salaries for people to work below professional level in such fields as teaching and medicine.

The funding is accomplished under the Economic Opportunity Act and is operated through the employment security division of the Alaska Department of Labor, Stevens said.

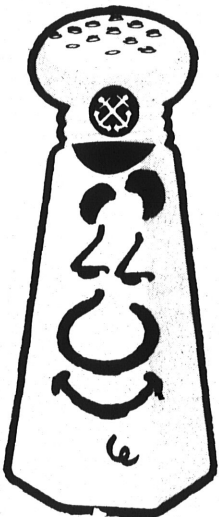
