The Fish and Wildlife Service reminds hunters that a federal permit is required to hunt brown bears within the Kodiak National Wildlife Refuge.

This fall the season will open October 20 and continue through December 31.

The refuge is sectioned into 52 units and only one party of

hunters is assigned to a unit at a time. There is no limit to the number of permits issued so conflicts may occur.

In such instances, the second party applying for an area must either wait until the first party has completed its hunt or select an alternate unit. Those people desiring a permit should request an application form by contacting the Refuge Manager, Kodiak National Wildlife Refuge, Box 825, Kodiak, Alaska 99615. Guides may make applica-tions for their clients. Permits will be issued in the order the

applications are received from the effective date of this an-nouncement, September 5,

A permit is not required to hunt bears outside the Kodiak Refuge boundaries in the re-mainder of State Game Management Unit 8
