Training Course at Santa Fe, New Mexico; and being the only Alaska Native in the first class of trainees.

Miss Lewis, a Tlingit Indian, received a letter from Ruth Hembekides, Chief, Nutrition Technician Training Course com-

mending her for, "Your diligence at work, your concern for the people you serve, and your willingness to do a little more than is expected of you, are qualities that will make you a much appreciated member of the Mt. Edgecumbe Service

Unit."

The training course consisted of 4 months of formal education at Santa Fe, New Mexico, followed by 8 months of supervised work experience in the trainee's home service unit, (Mt. Edgecumbe Service Unit,

Sitka, Alaska).

Trainees from the other IHS Areas are expected to complete their field experiences within the next few weeks. A second class of 8 Nutrition Technician trainees is scheduled to start late in August 1972.

Applicants for training are chosen from high school graduates, or GED, of an age feasible to permit consideration for college entrance later. This is to increase incentives and opportunities for the development of Indian and Alaska Native public health nutritionists and dietitians — health professionals who are in extremely short supply.
