Peaturing Charlie, a voungster from a rural village, and his relatives, the childrens booklet uses comic strip stories to explan how to make various types of long distance telephone calls, how to use directory assistance and what to do in case of an emergency.

The booklet, illustrated in yellow, blue and green, also contains educational games and puzzles that test children's knowledge of communications.
