Pribilof Islands Bill Progresses

The Senate Commerce Committee this week approved amendments Senator Bartlett's bill (S. 2102) to bring wide-ranging changes in the administration of the Pri-

bilof Islands. 'The bill is in three major parts. One restates and expands present law relating to the protection of the North Pacific fur seal, one repeals the 1944 Fur Seal Act, and the third makes changes in the administration of the Islands.

the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; would allow some 143 residents who worked in the fur seal industry before 1950 to receive Civil Service retirement credit, such benefits now applying

only to service performed

since 1950; and would esta-

blish a townsite on St. Paul
