

Holley New Head of Alaska Brick

JUNEAU—Jed T. Holley of Anchorage took office Monday as president of the Alaska Brick Group of Companies, it was announced by John Borbridge, Jr., president of Sealaska Corporation.

The companies, all located in Anchorage, were acquired in 1976 by Sealaska, the Juneau-based Native regional corporation for Southeast Alaska. Holley became vice president of operations of the Alaska Brick Group of Companies in 1977.

Holley's responsibilities include management of five operating companies which combine under the ABC banner as a major Alaskan supplier and manufacturer of building materials.

Alaska Brick Company manu-

factures a wide range of concrete block and concrete specialty items, and is also the Alaska distributor for numerous lines of building materials.

Alaska Aggregate Corporation (ALAGCO) manufactures and markets redi-mix concrete in the Anchorage area. Its new automated batch plant is considered one of the best of its kind in the nation. The firm's mining sites provide the sand and gravel required by the ABC companies.

Alaska National Corporation imports building products from Japan, and its sister firm, Alaska Stevedoring Company, performs stevedoring services for the Alaska Brick Group of Companies.

Pacific Western Lines oper-

ates a tug and barge service between ports in Washington State and Anchorage, fundamentally for the purpose of transporting bulk cement to ABC's Anchorage facilities. As a common carrier, PACWEST also transports building materials, equipment and other cargo.

Holley and his family moved to Anchorage in 1975 when he joined the firm of Crittenden, Casseta & Cannon/Hellumth, Obotal & Kassabaum (CCC/HOK). As director of Business Development, he was responsible for internal and external planning for the Anchorage architectural and planning company.

"There is no question that we will all benefit from Jed Holley's contribution to the Alaska Brick

Companies. He is considered one of the top men in the profession," Borbridge stated.
