The Arctic District Office of the Bureau of Land Management will hold public meetings in Nulqsut and Anaktuvuk Pass. These meetings will provide a public forum to discuss and take formal comments on the Utility Corridor Draft Resource Management Plan and Environmental Impact Statement. One part of these meetings will be a general discussion of BLM's proposed recommendations for managing natural resources throughout the planning area. Another part of these meetings will be a formal public hearing on the subsistence uses and needs within this same area. The public is encouraged to attend these meetings in order to formally and informally express their views on BLM's management recommendations in this draft management plan.

A general public meeting will be held in the Nulqsut Kisik Community Center on Wednesday, September 30, 1987, at 7:30 p.m. to discuss and explain the BLM draft recommendations for resource management in the planning area. A formal hearing will immediately follow this general meeting to officially record individual comments on the issue of subsistence uses and needs.

Anaktuvuk Pass

A general public meeting will be held in the Anaktuvuk Pass Community Center on Thursday, October 1, 1987 beginning at 7:30 p.m. to discuss and explain the BLM draft recommendations for resource management in the planning area. A formal public hearing will immediately follow this meeting to officially record individual comments on the issue of subsistence uses and needs.

**NOTICE TO AIRMEN,
GUIDES AND HUNTERS**

Lands adjacent to the northern boundary of the gates of the Arctic National Park in the Chandler Lake Region are the private property of the Arctic Slope Regional Corporation (ASRC). Certain site and trail easements are reserved on ASRC lands for public use in this area. Their use is limited to provide access to Chandler Lake by float plane, temporary (not more than 24 hours) camping at a site near the lakes' shore and, for trail access to adjacent public lands. Sport hunting is not allowed on ASRC lands, including easements, and entry upon such lands for any purpose other than access to adjacent public lands, including sport hunting, requires the written consent of the Arctic Slope Regional Corporation. Trespassers will be prosecuted.
