There are six vacancies on the Native Education Committee that will be filled through nomination and election at the meeting. Parents of JOM certified students interested in serving

on the board are encouraged to attend.

The public hearing provides JOM students and parents the opportunity to voice their priorities for future planning of JOM programs. Students must be at least one-quarter Alaska Native or American Indian to qualify for JOM. Both traditional and contemporary educational programs are offered through JOM.

Registration will begin at 6 p.m. The annual meeting and spaghetti dinner begin at 7 p.m., and the election will be held at 8:30 p.m.
