

Squalor Appall Canadians At 'Camp Ten'

Churchill, Man. (Special)—A party of 30 high-ranking Canadian government officials toured "Camp Ten," a government-sponsored Indian housing project, near here recently and were "appalled" at the squalor and conditions of poverty they saw.

Several group members said that living conditions in the Chipewyan Indian settlement were far worse than any they had seen in Canada's Northwest Territories.

The touring party included 23 members of Canada's parliament. They visited Frobisher, Inuvik, Yellow Knife, Fort Smith and other northern communities to "familiarize" themselves with problems in Canada's north country.

The Camp Ten settlement near Churchill will be moved next year to a new location. Sixty new houses will be built and the old buildings, at the old government project, will be destroyed.
