

# Daughter of Long-Time Pioneer Joins University of Alaska Faculty

The daughter of an Alaskan pioneer and long-time member of the University of Alaska Board of Regents will join the University faculty this fall as assistant professor of home economics.

The appointment of Ann Louise Walsh, formerly home economics teacher for Lathrop High School in Fairbanks, was announced by Dr. Charles Ray, dean of the College of Behavioral Sciences and Education.

Born in Nome, Miss Walsh began her college education at the University of Alaska but later transferred to the University of California at Santa Barbara where she graduated with a degree in education.

Returning to Alaska, she taught school in Fort Yukon, Wrangell, Nome and Fairbanks. In 1960 she earned her master's degree at the University

of Oregon.

Miss Walsh is the daughter of Mike Walsh, long-time resident of Nome and a former member of the University board of regents. She is a member of the American Home Economic Association, the National Education Association, the Alaska Education Association, Kappa Omicron Phi, Delta Kappa Gamma, and the Pioneers of Alaska.
