

13th meets in Seattle

The Seattle-based 13th Regional Corporation held its annual shareholders meeting Saturday, June 3 at the Seattle Cen-

ter. The non-resident Alaska Native owned corporation formed under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 elected three incumbents to the nine member board of directors.

Dennis M. Small, president, announced that Bert B. Bauer, Billy B. Johnson and James W. Price were elected to three year terms.

The 13th is principally invested in fisheries and housing. The fisheries division has four sea-going crabber-bottom fishing boats operating in Alaska waters, and has two more ships under construction. Alaska House Movers, AHM, Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of the 13th Regional Corp, recently purchased 40 homes in Frontier

Village, east of Everett, Wash.

AHM, Inc. is renovating the homes and preparing them for re-sale. The Native owned corporation's investments include apartment complexes in the Seattle area. The 13th also recently announced the production of a film which won the Western Hall of Fame Award and is to be marketed in schools throughout the nation.
