

Chignik Lake gets 75,000 acres

The village of Chignik Lake has received over 75,000 acres of land from the Bureau of Land Management. An interim conveyance was issued for 75,414 acres and patent for .14 acres. The land was selected under 12(a) of the 1971 Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act.

Chignik Lake, located in the middle of the Alaska Peninsula, is one of 29 villages in the Bristol Bay Region
