The Department of Natural Resources gives notice under 11 AAC 83.311 of an application for approval of the Camden Bay Unit Agreement. The proposed exploratory unit is in the Beaufort Sea, east of the Point Thomson Unit and offshore of the Alaska National Wildlife Refuge.

Arco Alaska Inc. (ARCO) filed the unit application with the Division of Oil and Gas on April 22, 1997. ARCO is the sole Working Interest Owner and the des-

ignated Camden Bay Unit Operator. ARCO's address is P.O. Box 100360, Anchorage, Alaska 99510.

In the Camden Bay Unit application, ARCO proposes to conform and modify eleven individual oil and gas leases so that exploration and development can be conducted on a unit wide basis instead of on a lease basis. ARCO requests a primary term of five years for the Camden Bay Unit Agreement. If DNRF and MMS approve the Camden Bay Unit Agreement, exploration and development of the unit area will occur in accordance with a unit plan of exploration and development approved by both agencies. The unit application includes an initial two-year plan of exploration that requires drilling the Warthog No. 1 well before April 30, 1998.

- Coin sent paid interstate calls from coin lines may be routed to any interexchange carrier selected by the customer who has the required coin signaling capabilities (i.e., coin recognition, coin control, etc.) which are required to complete the call.
- Request to Directory Assistance Service originated from payphones will be billed at the applicable rate of the Directory Assistance Carrier.
- The customer shall be responsible for the provision of booths, shelves, directories and all other ancillary equipment, along with the installation, operation, and maintenance of any customer-provided payphone used in connection with this service. They will have the same repair service that is available to simple business service.

BTI proposes to add the following terms to the Definitions section of its tariff.

- Answer Supervision Service- is the line side functionality that provides an electrical signal to the calling end of a switched telephone connection when the called line goes off-hook. Private Pay Telephone Answer Supervision will be provided for use with Private Pay Telephone Service as specified in this tariff to assist in determining when billing for a specific call should commence.
- Coin Line Service- is a coin voice grade exchange line, available where equipment and operating conditions permit, that provides switch based dial tone first (DTF) coin line functionalities for the connection of customer owned coin operated telephones (COCOTs). The term "Customer" is defined as the party subscribing to a Coin Line for the purpose of connecting a Private Pay Telephone to the local exchange.
- Private Pay Telephone- Private Pay Telephone Service is provided for use with smart pay telephones. The smart pay telephone only requires a loop to the central office to be fully functional. This rate is the same as the one-party Business Rate.
