Notice of Utility Tariff Filing

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION gives notice that UNITED UTILITIES, INC. (UUI), a local hange telephone company, has filed two tariff revisions (TA32-249 and TA33-249). This notice does not detail exchange telephone company, has filed two tariff revisions (TA32-249 and TA33-249). This notice does not detail every proposed charige in the two filings.

In TA32-249 UUI proposed to revise the custom calling provisions. Among other changes UUI proposed to modify several definitions, add definitions, and add rates for three new features. Excepts of the proposed new

definitions and recurring rates for the three new features are shown below

Customized Ringing-A line class of service that allows up to four parties (primarily subscriber plus three additional parties) to be assigned to the same line. Each party is assigned to its own subscriber directory number and distinctive ring. The billing goes to the primary subscriber

Dual Tone Multifrequency- A tone-signaling method of transmitting information in which a set of dual-tone pulses, one from a lower group of frequencies and one from a higher group of frequencies, is used to repre-

ast number Redial- A custom calling feature that allows a user to "redial" the number last dialed by depress ing a single key.

Line Class of Service- The collection of privileges and features assigned to phones in a system.

Speed Calling- A custom calling feature that allows a customer to use a 1- or 2- digit code to call any one of up to thirty preselected telephone numbers.

In TA33-249 UUI proposed to add rates and conditions for Custom Local Area Signaling Services (CLASS). According to UUI "CLASS features are available to single party lines only and at those locations where the switches have the necessary software." UUI lists those current locations as Alakanuk, Chevak, Emmonak/Sheldon Point, Hooper Bay, Mountain Village, Quinhagak, St. Mary's, and Toglak/Twin Hills.

The following table contains a summary of the proposed CLASS features and associated charges.

Discounts: When a customer subscribes to more than one CLASS feature for which there is a monthly recurring charge, a discount shall apply. The monthly rate for each additional CLASS feature shall be reduced by \$2.00.

UUI also proposes provisions concerning the applicability of the non-recurring charges to the CLASS

Following are excerpts from UUI's proposed definitions for the CLASS features:

Anonymous Call Rejection - A CLASS feature that allows a customer to reject calls from parties who have a status of "private" under Caller ID Blocking.

Automatic Callback - A CLASS feature that allows a customer to redial the last outgoing call automatier is busy, then the call will be attempted as soon as both parties are idle.

Caller ID - A CLASS feature that allows a customer to view, before the call is answered, the directory value. In Cartos i leading state along a customer to view, postrol fire can is answered, fire directive number of an incoming call. The number is displayed on a customer provided device attached to the customer's telephone line or on a telephone or answering machine with a built-in display screen. The Utility will forward all telephone numbers (including non-published and non-listed telephone numbers) subject to technical limitations.

<u>Caller ID Block</u>- A CLASS feature that allows customers to control whether their directory number is to be sent on outgoing calls to a called party who subscribes to Caller ID.

Distinctive Ringing/Call Waiting- A CLASS feature that alerts the customer by a special ring or special Call Waiting tone when a call is received from any of a pre-specified list of directory numbers.

Selective Call Acceptance- A CLASS feature that allows the customer to create a list of directory num m which the customer will accept calls. Calls originating from numbers which are not on the list will not be completed.

Selective Call Forwarding- A CLASS feature that allows the customer to create a list of directory numbers from which incoming calls will be forwarded to another directory number.

Selective Call Rejection - A CLASS feature that allows the customer to create a list of directory numrs which the customer does not wish to receive calls.

The Commission considers comments in determining the appropriate action to be taken. Filing comments will not make a person a party to the proceeding. To become a party, one must first petition to intervene in accordance with 3 AAC 48.110.
