AFN-JOM Sponsors Workshop






The WAAETP is a non-profit corporation serving and with a board of directors representing 14 western states.

Ms. Simeone plans to use her grant to complete the first year of a Master of Science degree in Community Resource Specialist (Alcoholism).


She plans to adapt the skills thus acquired to Alaska's regional and village settings developing cross cultural alcoholism prevention programs.




