

CFC Kick Off Successful

The Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) for the Fairbanks area was kicked off recently at a luncheon of the Fairbanks Federal Executives Association (FFEA).

Col. Richard Wallace of Ft. Wainwright presented the summary of last year's record-breaking collection in which over \$120,000 was collected; Over 60% or about \$70,000 of this total was contributed to the area's United Way Campaign.

Representing over 7,000 local Federal employees in 33 agencies, the FFEA was able to obtain a 70% participation level last year. According to Wallace.

"We shoot for a participation level rather than a dollar amount. The dollar amount naturally is high if we can get a high percentage of employees to contribute," he said.

Most of the Federal employees contribute by payroll deductions.

In addition to the contribution to United Way, the Combined Federal Campaign contributes to 13 other national and international organizations. The campaign will last until November 14 of this year.
