- 1) AAC 34.055 is amended by changing the school district bilingual education plan of service requirements; and
- 2) AAC 06.120(2) is amended by changing the uniform chart of accounts.

Please file on or before the 1st of February to avoid the 10 percent penalty that will be placed on your tax bill for filing late.

To homeowners applying for the \$10,000 tax exemption the deadline is February 15, 1987.

The last day to file for Senior Citizens exemptions is January 15, 1987.
