In a February 14 article concerning rural schools by Laury Roberts, the background of the Molly Hootch case, which eventually resulted in appropriation of general funds for rural school construction, was inaccurately and insensitively described. Although the State Supreme Court never handed down a decision in the case, it did approve a consent decree between the parties in the case. That out-of-court agreement embodied the State's intent to construct schools in rural areas.
