

# U.S. Forest Service has work

JUNEAU--Applications for 1978 summer and seasonal employment on two National Forests in Alaska are now being accepted and will continue to be until January 15, 1978. This closing date applies throughout the United States.

Summer and seasonal employment programs provide jobs between March and November. They are open to any U.S. citizen, 18 years or older, who is capable of performing hard out-

door work.

In Alaska pay scales for these summer jobs range from \$4.23 to \$5.99 per hour for qualified applicants.

Alaskan residents will receive hiring priority. Applicants with 60 or more consecutive days of previous work experience with the Forest Service in Alaska will also receive employment preference on the National Forest unit where their previous work was performed.

Job opportunities include field aides and technicians in forestry, engineering, surveying, recreation, biological science, and hydrology. Other jobs include staff positions with the Youth Conservation Corps (YCC), visitor information specialists and general laborers.

A special application form, No. 6100-23, is needed to apply for field aide and technician positions. These are available from any Forest Service office and should be completed and sent to:
