

Elections in Hoonah

The shareholders of the Huna Totem Corporation, meeting in Hoonah on October 24, elected three new board members and chose Huna Totem Director James Austin as president of the corporation.

The three new directors elected at the meeting are John Hinchman, Jr., who resides in Juneau and works with the Tlingit and Haida Housing Authority; Marlene Johnson of Hoonah, a Sealaska Corporation

director and owner of Southeast Skyways; and Ronald Williams, Employment Assistance officer in the Bureau of Indian Affairs Juneau Area Office.

Other than President Austin, the board of directors elected the following officers of the corporation: Johan Dibdahl of the Tlingit and Haida Housing Authority, vice-president; Frank O. Williams, Jr. of Sitka, community relations representative of the Public Health

Service, chairman of the board; Gerald Gray of Hoonah, vice-chairman of the board; John Hinchman, Jr., secretary; and Harvey Marvin of Hoonah and Juneau, a public accountant, was chosen treasurer.

Prior to the annual meeting, an informational shareholders meeting was held in Hoonah on October 21. Huna Totem directors elected in previous shareholders meetings include James Jack and Ernest Hillman.

Huna Totem investments to date include the Totem Lodge of Hoonah, a fleet of six boats which are leased during the fishing season, and an interest in the Shee Atika Hotel of Sitka.

The Huna Totem Corporation has also been actively participating in d-2 issues as they affect their shareholders and their descendants in the use of National Interest Lands in Southeastern Alaska.
