Notice is hereby given that the Department of Natural Resources, under authority vested by AS 38.05. 020, proposes to adopt, amend or repeal regulations in Title 11 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement, interpret or make specific AS 38.05 and AS 38.08 as follows:

(1) A new Chapter 53 is added which sets out the procedure for zoning state lands, specifies the use restrictions which apply under rural residential and open-to-entry zones, and zones six parcels of land as "Rural Residential." Two of these parcels are in the vicinity of Delta, one in the vicinity of Tok, two near Rex (between Healy and Nenana) and the remaining one near Central (between Circle and Circle Hot Springs).

(2) Chapter 54 is amended by adding two new articles on "Homesites" and "Open-to-Entry." The homesite article sets out criteria for classification, specifies application and permit award procedures, and has definition for "residence" and "habitable dwelling." The open-toentry article has entry procedures, method for termination of an expired lease, and conditions for issuance of a patent.

A new Chapter 57 is added which defines the activities permitted on land on which agricultural interests only have been conveyed by the State, provides for remedies in the event of breach of the use provisions, provides for exercise of an agricultural preference right, establishes notice and sale provisions, permits requirement of a farm development plan, provides for acquisition and disposal of other rights, establishes procedures for transfer of agricultural rights, and permits use of homestead credits in acquiring agricultural rights.
