Office Opens
ANCHORAGE, ALASKA May 10, 1974 - An employment office for non-construction jobs on the trans Alaska pipeline project has been established in Anchorage.
The purpose of the office is to process, employment applications for administrative, pro fessional and clerical jobs only
The office, at 845 K Street, will be open from $8 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. until 4:30 p.m., Mondays through Saturdays.

A similar office for nonconstruction employment will be established in Fairbanks in the near future.

The offices will accept applications for non-construction jobs for. Alyeska and its management contractor for construction of the pipeline terminal, at Valdez, and of pumping stations, for the trans Alaska pipeline.

An Alyeska spokesman said persons seeking construction jobs on the pipeline project should not make application to Alyeska or its management contractors, but should directly apply to execution contractors chosen to perform the construction work, or should contact labor union locals.

Announcements of contracts awarded thus far have been made available to the news media; other contracts will be similarly announced as the additional contractors are chosen.
