Geese and cranes have been reported seen flying north past the Eskimo village of Wales at the tip of the Seward Peninsula this week. Ernest Oxereok, a lifetime resident there said many of these ducks are migrating north even though there is still much snow cover over the Tundra there. The Bering Strait is still reported to be choked with ice from its American eastern shore to it's western shore on the Siberian mainland. The northward migration of sea mammals and ducks provides Eskimos along Alaska's arctic coasts with fresh meats, a subsistence activity done each spring.
