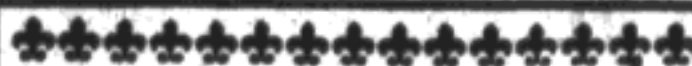

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ADOPTION OF PUBLIC INFORMATION REGULATIONS for EXECUTIVE AGENCIES, BOARDS and COMMISSIONS and PROPOSED REPEAL or AMENDMENT of CONFLICTING REGULATIONS

Notice is hereby given that the
governor, under authority vested by
AS 09.25.110, 09.25.120, and AS
44.17.030, proposes to adopt regu-
lations in Title 6 of the Alaska Ad-
ministrative Code, dealing with dis-
closure of public information and
records to implement AS 09.25.110
as follows:

6 AAC is amended by adding
new provisions (ch. 95), which
declare the executive-branch policy
on disclosure of agency records,
prescribe uniform procedures for
securing disclosure of public re-
cords, prescribe time limits within
which agencies must respond to
requests, prescribe appeal proce-
dures in the event a request for
disclosure is denied, and pre-
scribe fees for searches and copies.

Notice is also given that the gov-
ernor, the Departments of Com-
merce and Economic Development,
Education, Health and Social
Services, Natural Resources, Public
Safety, Revenue, Environmental
Conservation, Community and Re-
gional Affairs, and other agencies,
boards, and commissions, under au-
thority vested by AS 09.25.110 -
09.25.120, AS 44.17.030 and other
statutes propose to repeal or amend
regulations in other titles of the
Alaska Administrative Code which
currently deal with the procedures
of disclosure of public information
and records in a manner inconsis-
tent with the proposed 6 AAC 95.
