As required by AS 44.62.250, notice is given that, under authority of AS 47.05.010, the Department of Health and Social Services amended or repealed on this date substantial portions of 7 AAC 43.005 relating to the Medicaid program, which emergency regulations will take effect May 17, 1982. These emergency regulations place additional limitations upon benefits available under the GRM program, terminate certain benefits, and change the manner of application. They are based on a finding made on this date that appropriated funds are not sufficient to maintain benefits at current levels throughout the remainder of fiscal year 1982. These emergency regulations, which are to remain in effect for an indefinite period, are not expected to require increased appropriations.
