

60-Day Notice—

Native Allotments

Need for additional time for response to Bureau of Land Management requests for information was one of twenty-three points about Native Allotments raised by the Alaska Federation of Natives during June meetings with Secretary of the Interior, Rogers

C. B. Morton.

In July Interior acted on all twenty-three points, and increased the response period to BLM requests for additional information from 30 to 60 days.

The 60 day notice sent by BLM to some Native Allotment applicants is not a rejection. This notice is only a request for additional information.

After BLM adjudicators examine an allotment application and its field report, they may decide additional information is necessary to make a fair decision. At this point, they sent the applicant a notice requesting additional information within 60 days.

Approximately 90 per cent of the applications need additional information. This notification gives applicants a chance to provide additional supportive evidence for their application.

If no response is received from the applicant, the claim may be rejected. Therefore, it is critical that an applicant contact the Bureau of Land Management with additional evidence or a request for instructions or clarification before the 60 day period expires.

The Bureau of Indian Affairs and the regional corporation also receive a copy of the notice and field report. If the applicant needs help in preparing further information to support his claim, he should contact the BIA realty officer in his area.

In July Interior also directed BLM to provide training for adjudicators and field personnel about Native culture and traditional way of life. Additionally a joint BIA-BLM meeting was held in October to discuss solutions to mutual problems with Native allotments.

During the meeting BLM and BIA personnel met with Natives from around the state to learn more about Native culture and traditional use and occupancy of Native land.

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that KOTZBUE ELECTRIC ASSOCIATION, INC., has filed a tariff revision (TA9-17) consisting of proposed interim rates which would increase annual revenues by these approximate percentages:

Residential 5.94 per cent
Public Building 4.58 per cent
Small Commercial 8.34 per cent
Large Power 12.28 per cent

The utility states that operations for the first eight months of 1974 have resulted in a loss of \$27,650, which represents 31 per cent of members' equity at January 1, 1974. The utility further states that this interim rate relief is necessary to maintain its financial solvency and will be followed by an additional rate filing about the first of next year. The existing fuel cost adjustment surcharge will not be affected by the interim rate increase.

This project will consist of grading, drainage, paving and bridge construction, and utility relocation along 4.3 miles of roadway on Kodiak Island.

Principal items of work consist of the following 32.9 acres of clearing and grubbing; 521,000 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 25,000 tons crushed aggregate base, Grading C; 816 linear feet of structural steel piling; 273 linear feet of metal bridge railing; approximately 23,000 pounds structural steel and 135 MBF treated timber, lump sum, all required; sewer, water, telephone and electric power relocation; and miscellaneous items of work. Alternative "A" includes 5,663 tons of hot asphalt pavement and 374 tons of asphalt cement. Title 12 Chapter 40 is amended as follows:

Adopt new regulations regarding the registration of physician assistants and the medical services they may perform, including the educational and other qualifications, the application and registration procedures, the scope of activities authorized, and the responsibilities of the supervising or training physician.
